ST KEYNA PRIMARY SCHOOL'S END OF YEAR NATIONAL DATA 2022-23

Every year, schools have to report to governors, parents and carers, on how pupils are performing at the end of each key stage and in Year 1 how the children performed in their phonic assessments. I am pleased to report that this year has been another good year for St Keyna, especially considering the higher than average percentage of pupils we have with additional needs.



Reception Class

In Reception, 65% of the children achieved a Good Level of Development. This is a decrease on previous years and lower than national, however, our cohort had a particularly high level of emerging special education needs.

Reading – For the second year in a row St Keyna have exceeded national averages in reading (St Keyna 74%, National 73%) and our disadvantaged (PP) have done particularly well (St Keyna 75%, National 60%). The percentage working at greater depth (21%) is also our highest for the past 3 years.

Writing – Our percentage achieving the standard in writing (68%) is improved upon last year, but still lower than national (71%). However, our disadvantaged are slightly higher than national (St Keyna 59%, National 58%).

Maths – Our percentage achieving the standard in maths is improved upon last year, but just 1% lower than national (St Keyna 72%, national 73% ARE). Our percentage at greater depth is also just 1% short of national, but our disadvantaged have exceeded national (St Keyna 65%, National 59%).

Grammar, punctuation vocabulary and spelling – Whilst our percentage at GPVS is improved upon last year it still remains lower than national (St Keyna 64%, National 72%).

Science – Science follows a similar picture to GPVS being improved upon last year, but still lower than national (St Keyna 79%, National 80%).
