As part of our harvest learning each class will be making and baking a food which will be sold after school to raise funds for a charity (to be confirmed). Teachers will contact you via Class Dojo with the afternoon (at home-time) of the make & bake sale. Make and bake foods planned by teachers so far, range from Victorian gingerbread cake to courgette, carrot & honey muffins.

Nursery Uniform

- Purple sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Purple and white check summer dress
- Purple or white polo shirt
- Trousers/skirt of own choice
- Sensible shoes suitable for play in and outdoors (no open toes or shoe laces please)

Nursery PE Kit

Shorts and T-shirt (any colour)

School Uniform (Reception to Year 6)

- Jade green sweatshirt or cardigan (logo optional)
- White polo shirt (logo optional)
- Green and white check summer dress
- Grey or black pinafore, trousers or leggings, skirt or tailored shorts

- White, black or grey tights
- Black shoes, sandals or trainer/shoes (no open toes please)

Please note that trainers should only be worn for PE activities.

PE Kit (Reception to Year 6)

- Plain dark shorts
- White plain t-shirt (school logo optional)
- Trainers (outdoor games)
- Plain Tracksuit bottoms/leggings and school jumper/cardigan for outdoor games during cold weather.
- Not to include football kits or full tracksuits

Please note that we are now changing back to the Covid system of children coming to school in PE kits on PE days.

As I said at the start, the term has started smoothly and thank you for your continued support of our school.
