Academic achievement:

I wanted to draw your attention to a section of the school website. In the parents' section, there is a tab entitled 'Our 2022-23 Results Summary.'

Key achievements last year included:

- 96% of Year 1 children met the standard in the phonics screening check, putting us in the top 5% of schools in this area.
- Year 2 children performed very well in the KS1 SATs exceeding national averages in Reading, writing and achieving the national average in Maths
- Year 6 children also performed very well in SATs, broadly achieving in-line with national averages.
