

ST KEYNA PRIMARY SCHOOL'S END OF YEAR NATIONAL DATA 2024-25

Every year, schools have to report to parents and carers, the Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA), the Phonics Screening Check in Year 1, the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) in Year 4, and the end-of-Key Stage 2 tests (SATs) in Year 6. I am pleased to report that this year has been another good year for St Keyna, especially considering the higher-than-average percentage of pupils we have with additional needs.



Reception Class

In Reception, 61% of the children achieved a Good Level of Development. This is an increase on previous years but lower than national. It should be noted that our cohort had a high level of emerging special education needs (St Keyna 20% National Average 15%).

Year 1 Phonic Screening Check

93% of our Year 1 pupils met the required standard in phonics. This is much better than national average and continues our three-year trend of being in the top few percent of the country. Ensuring our children know their phonics is an essential element of them becoming competent early readers.

Year 4 have achieved the best average MTC score for the school in the last 3 years and exceeded national figures. 44 percent of them achieved full marks, a big improvement on previous years. Ensuring that our children know their times tables facts off by heart significantly supports them as they progress in the maths curriculum.

Reading – Disappointingly, 4 of our children narrowly missed the expected standard by just 1 or 2 marks which means that for the first time in a few years we are below national (St Keyna 72%, National 75%). However, our level at Greater Depth is better than national (St Keyna 34%, National 33%).

Writing – Our percentage achieving the standard in writing (69%) is much improved on last year and similar to national (72%).

Maths – In maths we comfortably exceeded national figures for ARE (St Keyna 78%, national 74%).

Grammar, punctuation vocabulary and spelling – Our percentage at GPVS is the same as we achieved last year and higher than national (St Keyna 74%, National 73%).

Science – Science is well above national at 94%.

Our percentage achieving the expected standard for reading/writing/maths combined is our best over the past 3 years and almost at national.

Disadvantaged Pupils

58% of our disadvantaged pupil group (those in receipt of Pupil Premium funding) have achieved the expected standard in reading/writing/maths combined and significantly outperformed historic national percentages at ARE (44%).

The average scaled score that the children achieved in their SATs is better than previous and the same as national for both reading and maths.
