Vocabulary:

Country - An area of land ruled by a Government

Continent - A large area of land made up of lots of countries

Continent - A large area of salt water (Atlantic Ocean, Pacific Ocean, Indian Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Southern Ocean)

Map - A drawing of a place, shown from above.

Atlas - A book of maps

Globe - A spherical model of the Earth

Year 2 Geography - Hot and Cold Places

Vocabulary:

North Pole - The northern most point of the Earth.

South Pole - The southern most point of the Earth.

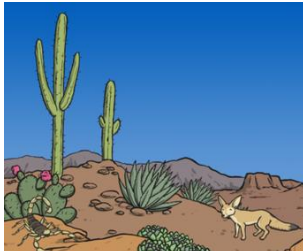
Equator - An imaginary line around the middle of a planet.

Weather - The temperature, and what is going on in the air (rain, snow, wind, hail...)

Temperature - How hot or cold something is.

Desert - A hot, dry area, often near the equator.

Rainforest - A hot, rainy forest, often near the equator.

Year 2 Geography - Comparing the UK with a contrasting location (ie Zambia)

Vocabulary:

UK - The United Kingdom is made up of four countries; England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales.

Human features: things built by people e.g. buildings, roads, bridges

Physical features: things created by nature e.g. rivers, mountains, seas

Compare - Saying what is the same and what is different.

Aerial photo - A photo taken from above, looking down on the ground

Compass - A tool which points out directions e.g. North, South, East, West
